Corimbya Eximia (Yellow Bloodwood)

Indigenous use

The leaves from the trees are used for smoking ceremonies. The tree is a natural medicine tree and a Grandmother tree, it provides lots of medicine and is very powerful

Description

Corimbya eximia is a small to medium gnarled, spreading evergreen tree, instantly recogniseable by its scaly rough, soft, flaky, yellow-brown bark. The foliage is broad with a strong green colour and may turn a paler yellow/green in the colder months. In Spring the tree puts on an eye-catching display covering itself in creamy yellow flowers.



Habitat

Corymbia eximia is a native to New South Wales. It occurs around the Sydney Basin often in high rainfall areas on shallow sandstone soils on plateaux or escarpments, in fire prone areas.
