Sydney Conservatorium of Music - Registration for Auditions

Round 1 Applications close 30 July

Musical Theatre applications close 8 September

Round 2 Applications closes 22 September

Round 3 Applications close 30 November

Entry to the Conservatorium is by audition. You must formally apply to the University of Sydney and through the Con's official audition portal.

Instrumentalists/vocalists (not contemporary music practice applicants)

Live auditions will be held at the Conservatorium. You will schedule your audition time in this portal. If you live outside Sydney and/or cannot travel to the Conservatorium for a live audition, you may submit a video audition – do this by registering your details in this portal and upload your video file by the deadlines.

Music Theatre applicants

You will submit your Part 1 video in this portal. Successful applicants will then be invited to attend a call-back live audition round at the Conservatorium on Sat 28 September.

Portfolio applicants (composition areas, contemporary music, musicology programs)

You will submit a portfolio and schedule your interview time in this portal. Interviews will be held via Zoom. You are welcome to register and schedule an interview in this portal prior to submitting your portfolio (and before the deadline).

UTS Year 12 Subject Scheme

The Year 12 subject scheme awards adjustment points towards your selection rank, based on your performance in select high school subjects that are relevant to your preferred UTS course. We've put together this scheme because we believe that your ability to undertake a course is better measured by looking at your subject marks in addition to your ATAR.

UTS Women in Engineering, IT and Construction

If you're female and have applied for selected engineering, information technology or construction project management courses, you're eligible to receive 10 adjustment points through both UAC and the Early Entry Program. These adjustment points are automatically applied (no additional application required) and contribute to your selection rank. Degrees range from Computing degrees, Games Development, IT, Engineering and Construction





Hard skills v soft skills



Who would win in a fight? A TAFE NSW report reveals which skills you will need most, and how you can get them.

Hard skills explained

Hard skills are: specific, quantifiable knowledge or abilities required for a job.

Increasingly, the most sought after hard skills will be in the areas of information and communications technology, machine learning algorithms, data science, drone piloting, information security, mechatronics, and remote equipment management." Hard skills are sometimes referred to as the 'doing skills'. These skills are ones that you can learn through the more 'traditional' education techniques and tend to be career specific.

Soft skills explained

Soft skills are otherwise described as "human", "social", "emotional", "interpersonal", or "people" skills.

They include communication, collaboration, customer service, ethics, creativity, complex problem solving, critical thinking, digital literacy, adaptability/'learn-ability', cognitive flexibility, emotional intelligence, initiative, judgement, decision-making, negotiation and persuasion, people management and conflict management.

These are often considered 'human' skills, as they are about being human and interacting with other humans. They are the most in-demand skills because they are transferable between jobs and even industries.

The program takes place in over thirty-five universities and tertiary institutions, within many different laboratories and lecture theatres. Participants perform experiments in the laboratories, meet and hear senior lecturers in the lecture theatres, attend site visits and walk around and experience what it is like to be on the campus of a university or tertiary institution. More than 84,000 students have taken this rare opportunity, up to date. The program also provides information about further studies in science, technology and engineering. It highlights the wide range of careers that allow students to pursue their interest and abilities in the sciences. One aspect of the program often commented on by participants is the opportunity to meet and share ideas with students from different schools.
