

<u>University of Sydney - Articulate Economics - Exploring Australia's Balance of Payments and Trade Dynamics in a Global Context</u>

In this talk, Dr IKM Mokhtarul Wadud will discuss Australia's balance of payments (BOP) in the context of open economy macroeconomics. The talk will highlight how Australia's BOP has evolved over recent decades, with special emphasis on how the dynamics of comparative advantage in trade of certain products and associated changes in foreign investment have shaped the Australian BOP and the Australian economy over the years. The role of the mining boom and the Australian economy's growth trajectory in the post-GFC period will also be highlighted. Dr Wadud will also draw the implications of such dynamics for Australia's BOP components namely, the current, capital and financial accounts, with special reference to Australia's prospect as a trading nation.



Beyond Blue - Young people (12-25)

Going through tough times? Stress, anxiety and feeling down can affect anyone, and happens to a lot of us at some point in our lives.

We all have good days and bad days. However, if you're feeling sad, down or anxious and these feelings have started to affect your everyday life, then it's important to find out what's going on and how you can manage it. Over 75% of mental health issues occur before the age of 25,1 while suicide continues to cause the largest loss of life of young people in Australia. It's never too early to start looking after your mental health and wellbeing so you can be the best version of yourself.

Things to consider before studying psychology



Psychology is a field where professionalism is of utmost importance. Psychologists need to participate in ethical conduct, which includes all forms of communication with clients. Skills that are essential in the practice of psychology include strong listening and communication skills, personal integrity, empathy and self-awareness. During the course of practice, a psychologist is expected to encounter clients who have a range of comorbidities and may require an interdisciplinary approach. This can mean liaising with a range of other health professionals. Psychologist Rebecca Ray also discusses how to treat clients with trauma without becoming traumatised yourself. It can be challenging to stay composed in session with clients, and the practice of mindfulness can assist with this according to clinical psychologist Samantha Clarke. Another clinical psychologist Dr Tara Hickey has also incorporated mindfulness into her practice with clients, as well as for her own wellbeing.
